COMPUTING TIP

For the ideal viewing height, position your monitor so that your eyes are level with an imaginary line across the screen, about 2 to 3 inches below the top of the monitor. If your screen is too low, you'll find yourself tilting your head forward to view the monitor (a common cause of neck pain). If it's too high, you may have to tilt your head back, leading to neck and shoulder pain - and increasing the likelihood of glare from overhead lights (a common cause of headaches).

Exception: If you use a large monitor (20 inches or larger), position your monitor so that the top of the viewing area is about 3 inches above eye level.
